RE: Reclamation Cost Escalation Factor for 2017: 0.0%

Following are national R.S. Means published cost index values and escalation factors used for forecasting reclamation costs. Escalation factors were calculated using index numbers and averaging equations identified on page five of Gordian's January 2017 Construction Cost Indexes with R.S. Means Data.

^{*} Starting in 2009, fuel costs and routine maintenance costs are included in the equipment cost.

Because the 2017 calculation yielded an escalation factor below 1.000 for the first time, and in an effort to ensure bond adequacy over the entire escalation interval, the decision has been made to limit the minimum escalation factor to an even 1.000, thus avoiding a scenario where less than the needed surety is held for the first years of the escalation (or de-escalation) interval.

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^{**} Starting in **2011**, the escalation factor has been based on the previous five-year interval. Prior factors were based on a three-year interval.
